


Women's Health focus of February Program



Donna Tartt, winner of the 2014 Pulitzer Prize for The Goldfinch, established herself as a

major talent with The Secret History in 1992. Considered a contemporary classic, this novel concerns a group of clever, eccentric misfits at an elite New England college and their charismatic classics professor, with whom they discover a way of thinking and living that is a world away from the humdrum existence of their contemporaries. When they go beyond the boundaries of normal morality, their lives are changed profoundly and forever. A number of our members have tackled the 800 pages of The Goldfinch with relish, so hopefully this will introduce the rest of us to this popular author with a somewhat lower time commitment!
