

### How does the Ohio Supreme Court Work?

Justice Sharon Kennedy of the Ohio Supreme Court will speak about "How the Ohio Supreme Court Works" on Monday April 14,2014 7PM at Midpointe Library, 125 S. broad Street.

Justice Kennedy graduated from The University of Cincinnati School of Social Work with a Bachelor's Degree in 1984 and the University of Cincinnati College of Law in 1991. She began her legal career as a police officer in the Hamilton, Ohio Police Department from 1985-1989. She served as a law clerk and director of the victim/witness division of the Butler County Court of Common Pleas from 1989-1991.

Justice Kennedy served as an Administrative Judge of the Butler County Court of Common Pleas, Domestic Relations Division for 13 years prior to being elected in 2012 to the Ohio Supreme Court. She has been active in



many community activities and received numerous awards of recognition, In 2013 she was named on of 13 professional women to watch by the Cincinnati Enquirer. She was considered worth watching because she is the first Butler County resident in 150 years to hold a seat on the state's highest court. She also has the distinction of being only the 9th woman to serve in the state's highest court.

## **Looking Ahead to May**



Are you a fan of the show Mad Men? This is your chance to learn how life really was in advertising for women during this seminal period. Maas writes a



humorous and at times poignant view of life as a career woman, wife and mother. Her choice of priorities was unusual, her success unimpeachable. ("I Love New York" was just one of her memorable campaigns.) Maas' book is based on her own experiences and countless interviews with her peers on Madison Avenue.

This book looks at the relationships between mothers and daughters through the lens of 31 Pulitzer Prize winners, perennial bestselling novelists, and celebrated broadcast journalists.

Reviewing AAUW's Mission statement - AAUW advances equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research - I see it's time to talk about that first element, advocacy. Since AAUW's founding our members and supporters have spoken out about policies

important to women and girls. Without their voices, invaluable legislation would have never been passed. In recent years, such legislation included the Family and Medical Leave Act, the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd Jr. Hate Crimes Prevention Act, and the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act. AAUW uses lobbying and grassroots efforts to push forward policies that break through educational and economic barriers for women.

By the time a woman, Sandra Day O'Connor, was finally appointed to the U. S. Supreme Court in 1981, AAUW had been working toward that goal for more than half a century. "AAUW's Original Binders Full of Women," at http://www.aauw.org/2013/09/25/original-binders-of-women/, is a fascinating account of AAUW advocacy at work. It's great background reading in preparation for our April program about the Ohio Supreme Court.

### **Another Successful Book Sale**


