the cast of men and women (the "unknown Americans") share how their new home is leaving its mark on their lives.







Book Sale Report

The 59th annual AAUW Book Sale is officially over. The sale took in \$8597.48. The money is counted and is ready to be distributed for scholarships. \$4000 goes to the Middletown Community Foundation for the \$1000 graduating high school senior scholarship, the three \$1000 returning college scholarships and the \$800 non-traditional college student scholarship. The second \$800 non-traditional scholarship comes from the interest on our foundation account. \$1000 was dispersed to the Dolly Parton Imagination Library for books for young children in our community. \$800 was given for 2 scholarships to the AAUW Be Wise STEM camp. Two middle school students will spend a week at camp this summer. Money is also being held for next year's expenses. Of course, the hope is that next year we will make even more money so we can fund more scholarships.
