

#### **About AAUW Dues**

Members are sometimes confused about the fiscal year, dues collection, and membership counting for AAUW. Here is a short refresher course based on information from the recent state conference.

- The AAUW fiscal year runs from July 1 through June 30.
- Dues collection for the next fiscal year begins March 16. In other words, we are collecting dues right now for the next fiscal year that begins in July.
- It is much simpler for finance officers if dues to state and national are submitted all together at one time.
- For membership counts for STARZ awards, dues must be fully submitted to state and national by September 15.
- Middletown AAUW usually passes out membership dues forms at the April branch meeting and collects money or checks at that meeting or at the Annual Scholarship and Installation Meeting in May.
- National dues have gone up this year to \$59. State remains at \$11 and Middletown remains at \$10. Make checks to Middletown AAUW for \$80 to pay all dues. Lifetime members do not pay national dues. Honorary members do not pay national or state.
