Diversity in the Workplace

Monday, January 10, 2022, 7:00 p.m. Virtual presentation on Zoom

Rev. Carrie Kreps Wegenast (she/her) is an ordained clergywoman in The United Methodist Church. After serving local churches for ten years, she answered a classified ad for a manufacturing chaplain's job with Tyson Foods. She figured the best way to learn what this was would be to apply and interview. She got the job. Exchanging a robe and stole for steel toed boots, Chaplain Carrie provides the emotional, mental, and spiritual care to over 800 team members. Her work includes walking through the manufacturing plant, and also she greets and counsels team members in the breakroom or her office. She provides resources fro barriers to employment, such as transportation, housing, child care, health or mental health. Her plant's workforce includes people from cities and rural communities, people ages 18 to mid-70s, people from a dozen countries, and people speaking American sign language, Arabic, Congolese, English, French, Hmong, and a variety of Spanish dialects.

While a Christian by birth and practice, Chaplain Carrie encourages team members to use their own spiritual values to navigate their current crisis. In addition to her ministry in the plant, Chaplain Carrie serves on several area Boards addressing concerns that impact the workforce. She is a mom (to Marti Kreps's granchildren), wife to a pastor from Germany, and long distance runner. She is currently working on a doctor of ministry degree in Interfaith Chaplaincy.


Thursday, January 20 at 7:00 pm My Life, My Love, My Legacy Coretta Scott King Need host
